This has been a most challenging year for us all and we hope that your valuable project work addressing STEM teaching and learning is continuing, even if it has altered significantly due to COVID-19. We will be hosting the *2021 STEM for All Video Showcase*, May 11th – 18th and invite you [to register](#) to present a short video of your federally funded project to improve STEM teaching and learning in formal and informal environments. [Registration](#) is now open until February 12th and is mandatory.

We know that the videos this year are going to be different. Many of us haven't been able to be in our work setting or in the classroom or at our project's usual venues. We still invite you to be a part of this unique opportunity to share your work. At the heart of your project's video is the story that only you can tell. This year you may rely more on graphics, stock footage, virtually-captured footage, animation, or illustration, but we know that you will find creative ways to tell your project's story. We are here to help and are running a [webinar on January 26th](#) to help you rethink how to creatively put together a video. Our home page also provides some [sample 2020 videos](#) that utilize some of these creative strategies and may provide ideas to convey your project's story.

This year's Showcase is also an opportunity to communicate how COVID-19 has impacted your work. The field will benefit from learning about each other's challenges and adaptations. How has your project survived or been modified during COVID-19? What did you learn that you will carry forward? What was the impact of COVID on your thinking about equity, access and broadening participation in STEM? Tell your story!

Timeline

- **January 15th – February 12th: Registration.** Register your intent to present a video. Registration is mandatory and it takes just a few minutes. You can find the link on the [Homepage](#).
- **January 26th at 3:00 PM ET: Webinar.** *Our team videographer, Jim Galdos will be providing a webinar to help you rethink how to creatively put together a video during COVID.* [Sign up now.](#)
- **March 2nd – April 21st: Video Submission.** Submit your video (less than 3 minutes in length) and presentation information through the site's Homepage.
- **May 11th – 18th: Interactive Video Showcase.** Thousands of participants will view the videos, partake in online discussions, and vote for their favorites.

This year's theme is *STEM for All: COVID, Equity & Social Justice*. Videos should address at least one of the following subthemes:

- Projects or partnerships addressing broadening participation
- Impacts of COVID on STEM teaching and learning
- Design and implementation of STEM and CS programs
- Research informing STEM and CS teaching and learning
- Measuring impact of innovative programs

Successful videos will describe the need that the project addresses, the intervention, innovation, or research, and the potential impact of the work. Video presentations will cover a wide range of topics including, science, mathematics, computer science, engineering, cyberlearning, citizen science, maker spaces, mentoring, informal learning, professional development, research and evaluation, NGSS and the Common Core. The videos highlight initiatives for students of all ages (pre-kindergarten through graduate school, as well as adult learners).

Presenters of past Video Showcase events have reported that this is a great way to disseminate your work broadly, learn of related work in the field, make new contacts and connections, and to receive feedback from researchers, educators and policy makers across the globe. Last year's showcase has had over visits from 75,000 people from 170 countries. Rich collegial exchange took place with over 6,000 discussion comments posted to the videos presented! if you have not presented before visit [last year's showcase](#) to get a better sense of the event.
