- Teachers

- Systemic structures
  - Identify ways programs can address inequitable systemic structures.

- Developing meaningful co-design with all interest holders.
- Building pathways & longitudinal studies from elementary to middle school, middle school to high school, high school to undergraduate and undergraduate to graduate.
- Increase resources to support teachers with integrating equity into their practice.
- Horizontal/shared power approach to decision making.
